Commerce - Section 1003 Early Learning Facilities - Eligible Organizations	Adds bond funding through the Early Learning Facilities Development Account to projects and corrects project names as follows: (a) \$19,000 for the Cora Whitley Family Center; (b) \$40,000 for the Hemlock Commons at Play Frontier project; (c) \$50,000 for Little Wings Early Learning and the project name is corrected; (d) \$50,000 for New Tomorrow's Hope Center and the project name is corrected; (e) \$50,000 for the Port Angeles YMCA Early Learning project; and (f) \$30,000 to the Redmond Childcare Expansion. Total change in bond funding: \$239,000.
Commerce - Section 1009 Early Learning Facilities School Districts	Adds \$90,000 in bonds to the Orting School District project funded through the Early Learning Facilities Development Account and corrects the project name. Total change in bond funding: \$90,000.
Commerce - Section 1012 Behavioral Health Facilities	Adds language allowing flexibility in the types of facilities that are eligible for grant funding. Adds bond funding as follows: (a) \$50,000 to Broadway - Compass Health; (b) \$16,000 to Cascade Community Health; (c) \$50,000 to Healing Lodge of the Seven Nations; (d) \$27,000 to Ithua Stabilization Facility; (e) \$23,000 to Pregnant & Parenting Inpatient Substance Use Disorder Treatment; (f) \$16,000 to Skagit County Crisis Stabilization; (g) \$50,000 to Sound Health 23-Hour Crisis Clinic and amends the project name to Sound Crisis Stabilization Facility; (h) \$50,000 to Spokane Stabilization Center; and (i) \$50,000 to Yakama Detox Center. Total change in bond funding: \$332,000.
Commerce - Section 1017 Public Works Board	Adjusts bond funding from 100% tax-exempt bonds to 10% tax-exempt bonds and 90% taxable bonds. Allows the bond-funded appropriations to be used to reimburse previously authorized grants and loans in addition to being used for new awards. Total change in bond funding: \$0.
Commerce - Section 1020 Housing Trust Fund	Adds language to the portion of the proviso related to projects that serve and benefit low-income people with developmental or intellectual disabilities that directs the Department of Commerce to consider prioritizing housing for individuals who are exiting residential habilitation centers or facilities. Adds language to the portion of the proviso related to subgrants for acquisition and preservation of mobile and manufactured home communities

Department of Natural Resources - Section 3106 Tukes Work Center Storm Water Mitigation	<p>Maintains funding level but switches funding source from bonds to Model Toxics Control (MTCA) Stormwater Account.</p> <p>Total Change:</p> <p>Bond funding: -\$383,000</p> <p>MTCA Stormwater Account: \$383,000</p>
Department of Natural Resources - Section 3111 Carbon Sequestration Forests	<p>Language is amended to provide that the working forestlands acquired pursuant to the appropriation will be managed for increased carbon sequestration and carbon storage through sustainable timber harvests consistent with statutory provisions related to sustained yields.</p> <p>No change in funding.</p>
Department of Agriculture - Section 6694 State Lands Assessment	<p>Removes \$100,000 in Climate Commitment Account funding to align with Section 7060.</p> <p>Total change in Climate Commitment Account: -\$100,000.</p>
Commerce - New Section in Part 6 (Section 6024)	<p>Add a reappropriation of \$39,452,000 in bonds for the 2021-23 Clean Energy V project.</p> <p>Total change in bond funding: \$39,452,000 (reappropriated).</p>
Commerce - Section 7010 2022 Local and Community Projects	<p>Removes \$155,000 in bonds for the Trails End Community Meeting Space (Tumwater) project.</p> <p>Total change in bond funding: -\$155,000.</p>
Commerce - Section 7011 2023 Local and Community Projects	<p>Removes \$200,000 in bonds for the Craft Beverage (Tumwater) project.</p> <p>Total change in bond funding: -\$200,000.</p>

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Commerce - Section 7018 2024 Local and Community Projects	Exempts the Lakebay Marina (Lakebay) project from Commerce grant requirements related to the nonstate share of project cost and reimbursement. Removes \$558,000 in bonds for the Puyallup Food Bank Facilities project. Total change in bond funding: -\$558,000.
Commerce - Section 7019 2025 Local and Community Projects	Exempts the Lakebay Marina Renovation and Historic Preservation project from Commerce grant requirements related to the nonstate share of project cost and reimbursement.
Commerce - Section 7029 Broadband Infrastructure Federal Match Projects	Increases the federal authority for the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment Program by \$25,469,000. Amends the corresponding reappropriation for 2025-27 in Section 6107 accordingly. Total change in federal authority: \$25,469,000.
Commerce - Section 7028 Anaerobic Digester Development	Moves Anaerobic Digester Development grants from the State Conservation Commission to the Department of Commerce. Revises the required non-state match amount from a minimum of 10% to a minimum of 15%. Sets aside \$500,000 of the Climate Commitment Account funding for the Washington State University Energy Extension Program to provide technical assistance. Makes a corresponding change in section 6106 in 2025-27 reappropriations. Total change in Climate Commitment Account: \$0.
Enterprise Services - Removed Section from Part 7 Legislative Building Centennial Skylights	Makes the following changes by removing amendatory section: (a) restores language related to the legislative intent to provide funding in the amount of \$7,271,000 for the Legislative Building Centennial Skylights project over the course of the 2023-25, 2025-27, and 2027-29 biennia and related contractual language; and (b) restores \$496,000 from the Capitol Building Construction Account and \$1,300,000 from the Thurston County Capital Facilities Account to the project. Technical changes related to the project's reappropriation are also made in Parts 1 and 6 of the proposed substitute. Total change: Capitol Building Construction Account: \$496,000 Thurston County Capital Facilities Account: \$1,300,000
Department of Ecology - New Section in Part 7 (Section 7050)	Modifies the project name of Eastside Fire and Rescue Pilot PFAS Cleanup to Lower Issaquah Valley PFAS Cleanup. Amends the corresponding reappropriation in Section 6489 accordingly. No funding change.
Department of Agriculture - New Section in Part 7 (Section 7060) State Lands Assessment	Removes \$100,000 in Climate Commitment Account funding. Total change in Climate Commitment Account: -\$100,000.

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Section 7070 - Repealers	Adds a repeal of laws of 2024, chapter 375, section 3020 for Anerobic Digester Grants in the State Conservation Commission. Grants are moved to the Department of Commerce.
Back of the Budget - Section 8002 Clover Park Technical College	Adds renovation to the purposes for which Clover Park Technical College may use certificate of participation project financing for the Eastside Training Facility project.
