By House Capital Budget (originally sponsored by Representatives Tharinger, Leavitt, and Callan; by request of Office of Financial Management)

Concerning the capital budget.

1 AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; amending RCW 79A.25.210,

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
17 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
18 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
19 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
20 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects

1 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
2 ending June 30, 2027, out of the several funds specified in this act.

3 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
4 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

5 (a) "Fiscal year 2026" or "FY 2026" means the period beginning
6 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

7 (b) "Fiscal year 2027" or "FY 2027" means the period beginning
8 July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027.

9 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
10 unappropriated status.

11 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
12 only for the specified purpose.

13 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
14 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
15 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
16 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

17 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
18 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
19 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
20 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
21 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
22 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
23 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2027-2029
24 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
25 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
26 the project or program in the future.

27 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
28 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
29 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
30 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
31 remaining on June 30, 2025, from the 2023-2025 biennial
32 appropriations for each project.

2025-27 Early Learning Facilities - Eligible Organizations (40000656)

The appropriations in this section are subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1)(a) \$52,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities development account—state appropriation in this section is provided solely for the early learning facility grant and loan program, subject to the provisions of RCW 43.31.565 through 43.31.583, and 43.84.092, to provide state assistance for designing, constructing, purchasing, expanding, or modernizing public or private

1 early learning education facilities for eligible organizations. Up to
2 3.5 percent of the funding in this subsection (1) may be used by the
3 department of children, youth, and families to provide technical
4 assistance to early learning providers interested in applying for the
5 early learning facility grant or loan program.

6 (b) The department is encouraged to leverage private and public
7 match funds when feasible and may not require match funds for
8 applicants experiencing financial hardship. The department may not
9 consider the level of project match funds as a competitive criterion
10 when selecting or recommending projects for funding.

11 (c) Grants may include awards for construction, renovation, or
12 facility purchase projects that will increase early childhood
13 education and assistance program capacity by supporting conversion of
14 slots from part day programs to full day programs or extended day
15 programs, or conversion of full day programs to extended day
16 programs, as defined in RCW 43.216.010.

17 (2) \$3,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities
18 development account—state appropriation in this section is provided
19 solely for emergency grants pursuant to HB 1314 (Early learning
20 facilities). The department may use up to \$112,000 of the
21 appropriation in this subsection (2) for administrative expenses.

22 (3) \$8,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities
23 development account—state appropriation in this section is provided
24 solely for minor renovation grants.

25 (4) \$6,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities
26 revolving account—state appropriation in this section is provided
27 solely for the Washington early learning loan fund. Up to four
28 percent of the funding in this subsection (4) may be used by the
29 contractor to provide technical assistance to early learning
30 providers interested in applying for the early learning facility
31 grant or loan program. The department may not use any portion of the
32 appropriation in this subsection (4) for administrative expenses of
33 the department.

34 (5) The department of children, youth, and families must develop
35 methodology to identify, at the school district boundary level, the
36 geographic locations of where early childhood education and
37 assistance program slots are needed to meet the entitlement specified
38 in RCW 43.216.556. This methodology must be linked to the caseload
39 forecast produced by the caseload forecast council and must include

estimates of the number of slots needed at each school district. This methodology must inform any early learning facilities needs assessment conducted by the department and the department of children, youth, and families. This methodology must be included as part of the budget submittal documentation required by RCW 43.88.030.

(6) When prioritizing areas with the highest unmet need for early childhood education and assistance program slots, the committee of early learning experts convened by the department pursuant to RCW 43.31.581 must first consider those areas at risk of not meeting the entitlement specified in RCW 43.216.556.

(7) The department must track the number of slots being renovated separately from the number of slots being constructed and, within these categories, must track the number of slots separately by program for the working connections child care program and the early childhood education and assistance program.

(8) When prioritizing applications for projects pursuant to RCW 43.31.581, the department must award priority points to applications from a rural county or from extreme child care deserts as defined by the department of children, youth, and families.

(9) For early learning facilities collocated with affordable or supportive housing developments, the department may remit state funding on a reimbursement basis for 100 percent of eligible project costs, regardless of the project's match amount, once the nonstate share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed in an amount sufficient to complete the entire project or a distinct phase of the project that is useable to the public as an early learning facility.

(10) \$10,940,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities development account—state appropriation in this section is provided solely for the following list of early learning facility projects:

31 (2) The department must establish a competitive process to
32 solicit proposals for and prioritize projects whose primary objective
33 is to assist libraries operated by governmental units, as defined in
34 RCW 27.12.010, in acquiring, constructing, repairing, or
35 rehabilitating facilities.

36 (3) The department must establish a committee to develop the
37 grant program criteria established under subsection (2) of this
38 section and review proposals. The committee must be composed of five

members as provided in this subsection. The committee must include:
(a) A representative from the department of commerce; (b) a representative from the department of archaeology and historic preservation; (c) the state librarian; (d) a representative from a library district; and (e) a representative from a municipal library.

(4) The department must conduct a statewide solicitation of project applications. The department must evaluate and rank applications in consultation with the committee established in subsection (3) of this section, using objective criteria. The ranking of projects must prioritize library district facilities listed on a local, state, or federal register of historic places and those located in distressed or rural counties. The evaluation and ranking process must also include an examination of existing assets that applicants propose to apply to projects. Grant assistance under this section may not exceed 50 percent of the total cost of the project. The nonstate portion of the total project cost may include cash, the value of real property when acquired solely for the purpose of the project, and in-kind contributions.

(5) The department must submit a prioritized list of recommended projects to the governor and the legislature by October 1, 2026, for inclusion in the department of commerce's 2027-2029 biennial capital budget request. The list must include a description of each project, the amount of recommended state funding, and documentation of nonstate funds to be used for the project. Individual grants may not exceed \$2,000,000. The total amount of recommended state funding for the projects on a biennial project list may not exceed \$10,000,000.

(6) In contracts for grants authorized under this section, the department must include provisions that require that capital improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee must repay to the state building construction account—state the principal amount of the grant plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of Washington general obligation bonds issued on the date most close in time to the date of authorization of the grant. Any repayments received pursuant to this subsection must be spent before any other amounts in the building construction account—state.

(7) The department must assist grant recipients under this section to apply for applicable competitive federal grant funding

and, upon receipt of any such funding, an equal amount of the state building construction account—state appropriation must be placed in unallotted status.

2 agencies, and research organizations for planning, design, and
3 implementation of capital projects and clean energy technologies that
4 reduce greenhouse gas emissions in vulnerable, overburdened, and
5 tribal communities identified by the department. The department must
6 prioritize grants providing meaningful benefits to vulnerable
7 populations in overburdened communities, as defined in RCW
8 70A.02.010.

9 (b) Eligible uses of grant funds include, but are not limited to,
10 planning for sustainable communities and predesign work, energy
11 efficiency improvements, renewable energy generation, increasing the
12 supply of affordable, energy efficient housing, developing resilient
13 and sustainable infrastructure systems, zero-emission, active
14 mobility, and micromobility transportation infrastructure, education
15 and engagement, and workforce development.

16 (2) Up to three percent of the appropriation in this section is
17 for the department to administer the grant program. Administration
18 includes, but is not limited to, identifying eligible communities,
19 providing technical assistance, managing contracts, reporting, and
20 providing planning and implementation assistance.

29 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
30 conditions and limitations:

31 (1) (a) \$25,000,000 of the climate commitment account—state
32 appropriation is provided solely for the department to administer
33 grants to eligible third-party administrators for heat pump and other
34 high-efficiency electric equipment rebates, with a focus on low and
35 moderate-income households, renters, nonprofit organizations, and
36 small businesses. State incentives and rebates for installation of
37 high-efficiency electric equipment, including electrical panel
38 upgrades, provide a benefit to the public consistent with the state's

energy strategy and climate mandates by reducing greenhouse gas emissions from the built environment. The department shall administer the grant program in a manner that seeks to maximize greenhouse gas emissions reductions.

(b) \$5,000,000 of the climate commitment account—state appropriation is provided solely for the department to administer grants to eligible third-party administrators for heat pumps for adult family homes.

(2) The department shall implement a statewide high-efficiency electric equipment program consistent with the following:

(a) Aid the transition of residential and commercial buildings away from fossil fuels by providing education and outreach resources for the installation of high-efficiency electric heat pumps and other high-efficiency electric equipment;

(b) Provide grants, coordination, and technical assistance to eligible third-party administrators to promote the adoption of high-efficiency electric heat pump equipment for space and water heating; and

(c) Develop strategies to ensure that the program serves low-income households, vulnerable populations, and overburdened communities, including dedicating at least 40 percent of the program funding for this purpose. For the purposes of this subsection (2)(c), "overburdened communities" has the same meaning as in RCW 70A.65.010 and "vulnerable populations" has the same meaning as in RCW 70A.02.010.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "eligible third-party administrators" include, but are not limited to, nonprofits, utilities, housing providers, community action agencies, and community-based organizations.

2025-27 Behavioral Health Facilities (40000667)

The appropriation in this section is subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for the department to issue grants to community hospitals or other community providers to expand and establish new capacity for behavioral health services in communities. The department must consult an advisory group consisting of representatives from the department of social and health services, the health care authority, one representative from a managed care organization, one representative from an accountable care organization, and one representative from the association of county human services. The amounts provided in this section may be used for construction and equipment costs associated with establishment or preservation of the facilities. The department may approve funding for the acquisition of a facility if the project will result in increased behavioral health capacity. Amounts provided in this section may not be used for operating costs associated with the treatment of patients using these services.

(2) The department must establish criteria for the issuance of the grants, which must include:

(a) Evidence that the application was developed in collaboration with one or more regional behavioral health entities that administer the purchasing of services;

(b) Evidence that the applicant has assessed and would meet gaps in the geographical availability of behavioral health services in their region;

(c) Evidence that the applicant is able to meet applicable licensing and certification requirements in the facility that will be used to provide services;

(d) A commitment by applicants to serve persons who are publicly funded and persons detained for involuntary commitment, as applicable by facility type, under chapter 71.05 RCW;

(e) A commitment by the applicant to maintain and operate the beds or facility for a time period commensurate to the state investment, but for at least a 10-year period;

(f) The date upon which structural modifications or construction would begin and the anticipated date of completion of the project;

(g) A detailed estimate of the costs associated with opening the beds;

(h) A financial plan demonstrating the applicant's ability to maintain and operate the facility; and

(i) The applicant's commitment to work with local courts and prosecutors as applicable to ensure that prosecutors and courts in

1 the area served by the hospital or facility will be available to
2 conduct involuntary commitment hearings and proceedings under chapter
3 71.05 RCW.

4 (3) In awarding funding for projects in subsection (5) of this
5 section, the department, in consultation with the advisory group
6 established in subsection (1) of this section, must strive for
7 geographic distribution and to allocate funding based on population
8 and service needs of an area. The department must consider current
9 services available, anticipated services available based on projects
10 underway, and the service delivery needs of an area.

11 (4) The department must prioritize projects that increase
12 capacity in unserved and underserved areas of the state.

13 (5) \$70,000,000 of the state building construction account—state
14 appropriation in this section is provided solely for competitive
15 community behavioral health grants to address regional needs.
16 Priority must be given to: Sustaining and preventing closure of
17 existing facilities; youth and adult bed capacity with consideration
18 given to gaps identified in the 2024 behavioral health capital grant
19 facility funding report; and facilities that serve specialized
20 populations, including, but not limited to, services for individuals
21 with traumatic brain injury, dementia, and cooccurring complex needs
22 of youth. Additional categories of facilities may be funded based on
23 identified needs of a region. Eligible facilities include, but are
24 not limited to:

25 (a) Crisis relief centers and stabilization facilities that offer
26 access to mental health and substance use care for no more than 23
27 hours and 59 minutes per patient, at a time, and are not subject to
28 federal funding restrictions that apply to institutions of mental
29 diseases;

30 (b) Mental health peer respite centers that are not subject to
31 federal funding restrictions that apply to institutions of mental
32 diseases. No more than one mental health peer respite center should
33 be funded in each of the 10 regions;

34 (c) Grants to community providers to increase long-term intensive
35 inpatient psychiatric treatment services and capacity for children
36 and minor youth including, but not limited to, services for substance
37 use disorder treatment, sexual assault and traumatic stress, anxiety,
38 or depression, and interventions for children exhibiting aggressive
39 or depressive behaviors in facilities that are not subject to federal
40 funding restrictions;

1 (d) Grants to community hospitals, freestanding evaluation and
2 treatment providers, or freestanding psychiatric hospitals to develop

17 and make efforts to enact the recommendations of the housing needs

20 2021. The department must consider prioritizing funding under this
21 subsection for housing that serves individuals who are exiting
22 residential habilitation centers or facilities.

23 (c) \$100,000,000 of the state taxable building construction
24 account—state appropriation is provided solely for permanent
25 supportive housing projects in accordance with the apple health and
26 homes rapid permanent supportive housing program created in RCW
27 43.330.187.

28 (d) \$32,000,000 of the state building construction account—state
29 appropriation and \$48,000,000 of the state taxable building
30 construction account—state appropriation in this section are provided
31 solely for the development of homeownership projects affordable to
32 first-time low-income households. Projects serving homebuyers whose
33 income is up to 80 percent of the area median income, adjusted for
34 household size for the county where the property is located are
35 eligible to apply, except that projects located in rural areas of the
36 state, as defined by the department, serving homebuyers whose income
37 is up to 100 percent of the area median income, adjusted for
38 household size for the county where the property is located are
39 eligible to apply. Eligible activities include, but are not limited

15 appropriation is provided solely for affordable housing preservation
16 projects, which may include, but are not limited to:

17 (i) Projects preserving and extending the affordability
18 commitment period for projects in the housing trust fund portfolio.
19 The funds may be provided for major building improvements,
20 preservation, and system replacements, necessary for the existing
21 housing trust fund portfolio to maintain its long-term viability. The
22 department must require a capital needs assessment be provided before
23 contract execution. Funds may not be used to add or expand the
24 capacity of the property. When allocating funds, the department must
25 prioritize buildings that are older than 15 years and that serve very
26 low-income and extremely low-income populations.

27 (ii) Projects preserving affordable multifamily housing at risk
28 of losing its affordability due to expiration of use restrictions
29 that otherwise require affordability including, but not limited to,
30 United States department of agriculture funded multifamily housing.
31 The department must prioritize projects that satisfy the goal of
32 long-term preservation of Washington's affordable multifamily housing
33 stock, particularly in rural areas of the state. Funds may be used
34 for acquisition or for acquisition and rehabilitation of properties

(2) \$3,000,000 of the state building construction account—state appropriation is provided solely for the department to provide preconstruction and technical assistance awards in accordance with RCW 43.185A.170. By January 1, 2027, the department must provide the governor and the appropriate committees of the legislature with a progress report for entities receiving awards made under this subsection (2). The progress report must list which entities applied for, and were successful in securing, additional financing for the construction or preservation of affordable housing.

(3) \$5,000,000 of the state building construction account—state appropriation in this section is provided solely for affordable housing urgent repair grants to be provided on an ongoing basis. Funding is not subject to the 60-day notification requirement in RCW 43.185A.150. The funding may be provided to address nonreoccurring repair projects including repair of units or buildings, abatement of potentially hazardous materials, and safety-related structural improvements of affordable housing. Each repair grant award may not exceed \$200,000 per award. However, the department may not limit the number of awards or amount received per organization.

(a) For purposes of this subsection (3), "affordable housing" means:

(i) Permanent supportive housing as defined in RCW 36.70A.030; and

(ii) Multifamily affordable housing projects in the housing trust fund portfolio.

(b) If the department receives application requests that exceed the appropriation level in this subsection (3), the department must prioritize projects under (a)(i) of this subsection (3).

(1) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for competitive grants to eligible entities for predevelopment, design, and construction of projects that provide a public benefit through research, development, demonstration, or deployment of clean energy technologies that save energy and reduce energy costs, reduce harmful air emissions, or increase energy independence for the state. Priority must be given to projects that benefit vulnerable populations and overburdened communities, including tribes.

(2) Entities eligible for grant funding under this section include local governments, federally recognized tribal governments and tribes' contracted service providers, public and private utilities that serve retail customers in the state, for-profit entities, research institutions, nonprofit organizations, and state agencies.

1 (3) To be eligible, a project must be consistent with the state
2 energy strategy adopted under chapter 43.21F RCW and policies under
3 chapter 19.405 RCW. To the extent practicable, the department must
4 prioritize projects that build upon Washington's strengths in
5 aerospace, maritime, information and communications technology, grid
6 modernization, advanced materials, and decarbonizing the built

8 (4) The department must invite stakeholders to participate in the
9 design and implementation of grant programs funded under this
10 section. The department must consider equity and environmental

(c) Prioritize projects seeking any applicable clean energy tax credits and incentives when developing and applying competitive criteria for selecting recipients under this section; and

(d) Consider the availability of any federal tax credits or other federal or nonfederal grants or incentives that the applicant may benefit from in review of the application.

(5) Funding awards made under this section may not exceed 100 percent of the cost of the project.

(6) \$650,000 of the state building construction account—state appropriation in this section is provided solely for the Northshore Senior Center Battery Storage project.

1 the action agenda developed under RCW 90.71.260; regional recovery
2 plans created under RCW 77.85.090; the habitat project lists
3 developed pursuant to RCW 77.85.050; the prioritization process
4 developed under RCW 77.95.160; and priority projects identified for
5 salmon recovery through agency grant programs.

6 (4) Conditions for awarding funding for projects under this
7 program include, but are not limited to:

8 (a) Consistency with the program criteria established under

The appropriation in this section is subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1) \$7,350,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities development account—state appropriation in this section is provided solely for minor renovation grants.

(2) (~~(\$46,550,000)~~) \$39,830,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities development account—state and \$6,720,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities revolving account—state appropriations in this section (~~(is)~~) are provided solely for the early learning facility grant and loan program, subject to the provisions of RCW 43.31.573 through 43.31.583 and 43.84.092, to provide state assistance for designing, constructing, purchasing, expanding, or modernizing public or private early learning education facilities for eligible organizations. Up to four percent of the funding in this subsection may be used by the department of children, youth, and families to provide technical assistance to early learning providers interested in applying for the early learning facility grant or loan program.

(3) The department of children, youth, and families must develop methodology to identify, at the school district boundary level, the geographic locations of where early childhood education and assistance program slots are needed to meet the entitlement specified in RCW 43.216.556. This methodology must be linked to the caseload forecast produced by the caseload forecast council and must include estimates of the number of slots needed at each school district. This methodology must inform any early learning facilities needs assessment conducted by the department and the department of children, youth, and families. This methodology must be included as part of the budget submittal documentation required by RCW 43.88.030.

(4) When prioritizing areas with the highest unmet need for early childhood education and assistance program slots, the committee of early learning experts convened by the department pursuant to RCW 43.31.581 must first consider those areas at risk of not meeting the entitlement specified in RCW 43.216.556.

(5) The department must track the number of slots being renovated separately from the number of slots being constructed and, within these categories, must track the number of slots separately by program for the working connections child care program and the early childhood education and assistance program.

(6) When prioritizing applications for projects pursuant to RCW 43.31.581, the department must award priority points to applications from a rural county or from extreme child care deserts as defined by the department of children, youth, and families.

(7) For early learning facilities collocated with affordable or supportive housing developments, the department may remit state funding on a reimbursement basis for 100 percent of eligible project costs, regardless of the project's match amount, once the nonstate share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed in an amount sufficient to complete the entire project or a distinct phase of the project that is useable to the public as an early learning facility. These projects are not subject to section 8015 of this act or RCW 43.88.150.

The appropriations in this section are subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1) ~~((The))~~ Except as provided in subsection (10) of this section, the department shall not expend the appropriation in this section unless and until the nonstate share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed, or both, in an amount sufficient to complete the project or a distinct phase of the project that is useable to the public for the purpose intended by the legislature. This requirement does not apply to projects where a share of the appropriation is for design costs only.

(2) Prior to receiving funds, project recipients must demonstrate that the project site is under control for a minimum of 10 years, either through ownership or a long-term lease. This requirement does not apply to appropriations for preconstruction activities or appropriations in which the sole purpose is to purchase real property that does not include a construction or renovation component.

(3) Projects funded in this section may be required to comply with Washington's high performance building standards under chapter 39.35D RCW.

(4) Project funds are available on a reimbursement basis only and may not be advanced under any circumstances.

(5) In contracts for grants authorized under this section, the department shall include provisions that require that capital improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee shall repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of Washington general obligation bonds issued most closely to the date of authorization of the grant.

(6) Projects funded in this section, including those that are owned and operated by nonprofit organizations, are generally required to pay state prevailing wages.

(7) The department must comply with the requirements set forth in executive order 21-02 and must consult with the department of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes on the potential effects of these projects on cultural resources and historic properties. Consultation with the department of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be initiated before project funds are made available.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure
4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND
10 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies
11 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency,
12 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in
13 not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing

34 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost

36 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most
37 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop

No transfers may occur between projects to local government agencies except where the grants are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes that govern the grants.

(2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can be completed within the biennium for less than the amount appropriated in this act.

(3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a project in a different way.

(4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed with the fiscal committees of the legislature by the office of financial management at least 30 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers within 30 days from the date of transfer.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8008.** (1) It is expected that projects be
2 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
3 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
4 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
5 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of
6 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
7 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
8 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
9 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
10 community projects, and minor works.

11 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
12 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
13 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
14 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
15 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
16 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
17 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

18 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
19 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
20 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
21 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8009.** Any building project that receives over
23 \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
24 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
25 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
26 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
27 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas
28 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be
29 integrated into the building project:

30 (1) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
31 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
32 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
33 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
34 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
35 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
36 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
37 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

38 (2) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
39 size and complexity of the building and its system components in

1 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
2 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
3 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
4 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
5 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
6 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

7 (3) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
8 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
9 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
10 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
11 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
12 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by 50
13 percent below preretrofit baseline.

14 (4) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy
15 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-
16 cycle cost effective.

17 (5) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
18 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
19 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

20 (6) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000
21 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major
22 construction and renovation projects to track and continuously
23 optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and
24 steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate,
25 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
26 occupants on energy use.

27 (7) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
28 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
29 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
30 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8010.** State agencies, including institutions
32 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
33 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
34 for operating expenditures.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8011.** Executive Order No. 21-02,
36 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective April 7,
37 2021. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in this
38 executive order and must consult with the department of archaeology

1 and historic preservation and affected tribes on the potential
2 effects of projects on cultural resources and historic properties
3 proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition projects,
4 including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in
5 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department
6 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be
7 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to
8 construction or taking title.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8012.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
10 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of the moneys appropriated in
11 this act for original construction of school plant facilities is
12 provided solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

13 (2) One-half of one percent of the moneys appropriated in this
14 act for original construction, or any major renovation or remodel
15 work exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided
16 solely for the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

17 (3) One-half of one percent of the moneys appropriated in this
18 act for original construction of any public building by a state
19 agency identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the
20 purposes of RCW 43.17.200.

21 (4) At least 75 percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
22 state arts commission during the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium for the
23 purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be
24 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art; no more than
25 20 percent may be expended for program administration; and no more
26 than four percent may be expended to conserve or maintain existing
27 pieces in the state art collection.

28 (5) Beginning with new appropriations made in the 2025-2027
29 fiscal biennium, art allocations not expended by the end of the
30 second full fiscal biennium from the issuance of a certificate of
31 occupancy shall lapse, except for art allocations made under K-3
32 class size reduction grants under section 6313 of this act.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8013.** To carry out the provisions of this
34 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
35 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

36 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8014.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
37 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the

1 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
2 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
3 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
4 prior approval of the director of financial management in
5 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
6 of representatives capital budget committee.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8015.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
8 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
9 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
10 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
11 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
12 the intended state share of total project costs.

13 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
14 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
15 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the
16 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
17 phase of the project.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8016.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
19 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
20 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
21 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
22 construction account as deemed necessary by the state treasurer, on
23 behalf of the state finance committee, to comply with the federal
24 internal revenue service rules and regulations pertaining to the use
25 of nontaxable bond proceeds. Portions of the general obligation bond
26 proceeds authorized by chapter . . ., Laws of 2025 ((H-2081.3/25)

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8017.** (1) Minor works project lists are
4 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a
5 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,500,000
6 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects
7 that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act
8 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit
9 project lists to the office of financial management for review and
10 approval.

11 (2) Revisions to the project lists, including the addition of
12 projects and the transfer of funds between projects, are allowed but
13 must be submitted to the office of financial management, the house of
14 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and
15 means committee for review and comment, and must include an
16 explanation of variances from prior approved lists. Any project list
17 revisions must be approved by the office of financial management

(d) Minor works preservation projects may include program improvements of no more than 25 percent of the individual minor works preservation project cost.

(e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor works categories.

(4) In the 2027-2029 capital budget instructions, the office of financial management shall increase the minor works threshold to \$2,000,000, with the exception of higher education minor works projects that may be valued up to \$4,000,000. It is the intent of the legislature to increase the minor works threshold for the 2027-2029 biennial budget to \$2,000,000, with the exception of higher education minor works projects that may be valued up to \$4,000,000.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8018.** To the extent that any appropriation authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building construction account, or from any other capital project account in the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8020.** On July 1, 2025, the state treasurer shall transfer \$21,307,000 of federal funding, or as much thereof as is remaining, from the appropriation in section 7017, chapter 474, Laws of 2023 to the federal broadband account created in RCW 43.330.400 (section 8036 of this act).

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8021.** The department of natural resources
2 must coordinate with the department of social and health services on
3 any long-term, revenue-generating opportunities it pursues on the
4 Fircrest campus for the purpose of structuring projects to have the
5 least impact on the clients served by the residential habilitation
6 center and on the center's daily operations to the greatest extent

4 department of ecology to track expenditures as described in RCW

6 **Sec. 8025.** RCW 79A.25.210 and 2024 c 375 s 8007 are each amended

26 committee must develop specific criteria to achieve the
27 prioritization. The submitted prioritized list must describe the
28 project, the proposed state funding level, and the estimated total
29 project cost including other funding and in-kind resources. The list
30 must also indicate student achievement measures that will be used to
31 evaluate the benefits of the project. The superintendent of public
32 instruction and the governor may determine the level of funding in
33 their omnibus capital appropriations act requests to support small
34 school district modernization grants, but their funding requests must
35 follow the prioritized list prepared by the advisory committee unless
36 new information determines that a specific project is no longer
37 viable as proposed.

38 (5) Coordination with the school construction assistance program.

39 (a) The full administrative and procedural process of school
40 construction assistance program funding under RCW 28A.525.162 through

1 28A.525.180 may be streamlined by the office of the superintendent of
2 public instruction in order to coordinate eligible school
3 construction assistance program funding with the small school
4 district modernization grants. Such coordination must ensure that
5 total state funding from both grants does not exceed total project
6 costs minus available local resources.

7 (b) Projects seeking small school district modernization grants
8 must meet the requirements for a school construction assistance
9 program grant except for the following: (i) The estimated cost of the
10 project may be less than ~~((forty))~~ 40 percent of the estimated
11 replacement value of the facility, and (ii) local funding assistance
12 percentage requirements of the school construction assistance program
13 do not apply. However, available district and state-tribal education
14 compact school resources are considered in prioritizing small school
15 district modernization grants.

16 (6) Disbursement of grant funds and reporting requirements. The
17 office of the superintendent of public instruction must award grants
18 to school districts and state-tribal education compact schools. The
19 grant must not be awarded until the district or state-tribal
20 education compact school has identified available local and other
21 resources sufficient to complete the approved project considering the
22 amount of the state grant. The grant must specify reporting
23 requirements from the district or state-tribal education compact
24 school, which must include updating all pertinent information in the
25 inventory and condition of schools data system and submitting a final
26 project report as specified by the office of the superintendent of
27 public instruction in consultation with the school facilities
28 citizen~~((s-[citizen]))~~ advisory panel specified in RCW 28A.525.025.

29 (7) From the effective date of this section through June 30,
30 2027, school districts receiving a small district modernization grant
31 under this section may not combine this grant funding either with a
32 school construction assistance program grant or with other grants
33 awarded under this section to fund a single project.

34 NEW SECTION. Sec. 8040. (1) The Joel Pritchard State Library,
35 which is located on the state capitol grounds at 415 15th Avenue
36 Southwest in Olympia, Washington, and which is currently undergoing a
37 substantial renovation, is renamed the Joel Pritchard Building,
38 consistent with the recommendations from the state capitol committee

1 and the department of enterprise services, and with the advice of the
2 capitol campus design advisory committee.

3 (2) The department of enterprise services shall affix the name
4 "Joel Pritchard Building" to the building at or near the completion
5 of the renovation project.

6 **Sec. 8041.** RCW 43.31.574 and 2024 c 230 s 2 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 For early learning facilities collocated with affordable or
9 supportive housing developments, the department may remit state
10 funding on a reimbursement basis for 90 percent of eligible project
11 costs, regardless of the project's match amount, once the nonstate
12 share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed
13 in an amount sufficient to complete the entire project or a distinct
14 phase of the project that is useable to the public as an early
15 learning facility. During the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium, the
16 department may remit state funding on a reimbursement basis for 100
17 percent of eligible project costs. Eligible housing developments are
18 projects that have received public funding and have secured enough
19 funding to complete construction of the project that will result in a
20 certificate of occupancy to open the affordable housing development,
21 including the early learning facility.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8042.** If any provision of this act or its
23 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
24 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
25 persons or circumstances is not affected.

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8043.** This act is necessary for the immediate
27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
28 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
29 effect immediately.
