16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
18 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
19 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
20 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
21 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects

1 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
2 ending June 30, 2027, out of the several funds specified in this act.

3 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
4 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

5 (a) "Fiscal year 2026" or "FY 2026" means the period beginning
6 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

7 (b) "Fiscal year 2027" or "FY 2027" means the period beginning
8 July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027.

9 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
10 unappropriated status.

11 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
12 only for the specified purpose.

13 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
14 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
15 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
16 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

17 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
18 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
19 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
20 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
21 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
22 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
23 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2027-2029
24 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
25 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
26 the project or program in the future.

27 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
28 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
29 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
30 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
31 remaining on June 30, 2025, from the 2023-2025 biennial
32 appropriations for each project.

32 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
33 conditions and limitations:

1 (1) \$10,000,000 of the Ruth Lecocq Kagi early learning facilities
2 development account—state appropriation in this section is provided
3 solely for minor renovation grants.

4 (2) \$60,000,000 of the Ruth Lecocq Kagi early learning facilities
5 development account—state appropriation in this section is provided
6 solely for the early learning facility grant and loan program,
7 subject to the provisions of RCW 43.31.573 through 43.31.583 and
8 43.84.092, to provide state assistance for designing, constructing,
9 purchasing, expanding, or modernizing public or private early
10 learning education facilities for eligible organizations. Up to three
11 percent of the funding in this subsection may be used by the
12 department of children, youth, and families to provide technical
13 assistance to early learning providers interested in applying for the
14 early learning facility grant or loan program.

15 (3)(a) The department of children, youth, and families must
16 develop methodology to identify, at the school district boundary
17 level, the geographic locations of where early childhood education
18 and assistance program slots are needed to meet the entitlement
19 specified in RCW 43.216.556. This methodology must be linked to the
20 caseload forecast produced by the caseload forecast council and must
21 include estimates of the number of slots needed at each school
22 district. This methodology must inform any early learning facilities
23 needs assessment conducted by the department and the department of
24 children, youth, and families. This methodology must be included as
25 part of the budget submittal documentation required by RCW 43.88.030.

26 (b) When prioritizing areas with the highest unmet need for
27 early childhood education and assistance program slots, the committee
28 of early learning experts convened by the department pursuant to RCW
29 43.31.581 must first consider those areas at risk of not meeting the
30 entitlement specified in RCW 43.216.556.

31 (c) The department must track the number of slots being renovated
32 separately from the number of slots being constructed and, within
33 these categories, must track the number of slots separately by
34 program for the working connections child care program and the early
35 childhood education and assistance program.

36 (d) When prioritizing applications for projects pursuant to RCW
37 43.31.581, the department must award priority points to applications
38 from a rural county or from extreme child care deserts as defined by
39 the department of children, youth, and families.

(e) For early learning facilities collocated with affordable or supportive housing developments, the department may remit state funding on a reimbursement basis for 100 percent of eligible project costs, regardless of the project's match amount, once the nonstate share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed in an amount sufficient to complete the entire project or a distinct phase of the project that is useable to the public as an early learning facility. These projects are not subject to section 8014 of this act or RCW 43.88.150.

(4) \$3,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities revolving account—state appropriation in this section is provided solely for implementation of the emergency grants program established in House Bill No. 1314 (concerning the early learning facilities grant and loan program). The department shall contract with one or more nongovernmental private-public partnerships that are certified by the community development financial institutions fund to award and administer the emergency grants on an on-going basis to eligible organizations. If the bill is not enacted by June 30, 2025, the amounts provided in this subsection (4) shall lapse.

(1) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for the department to provide planning, technical assistance, and predevelopment grants to local governments and federally recognized tribal governments for projects that would directly benefit overburdened communities, as defined by RCW 70A.02.010, that have been historically underserved by capital grant programs.

(2) In awarding grants under this section, the department shall prioritize applications that advance community housing, energy, and infrastructure needs. In ranking and sizing grants, the department may consider the financial capacity of the applicant and of the community that the grant would benefit.

(3) The department must provide a report to the appropriate committees of the legislature and the governor by October 1, 2026. The report must include:

(a) A list and description of the projects approved for funding, including state funding and total project cost;

(b) A status report of projects that received funding; and

(c) A description of the solicitation and evaluation process, including, but not limited to, applications received, the total amount of funding requested, and issues encountered.

(4) The department may use up to four percent of the appropriation in this section to administer the program, including, but not limited to, providing technical assistance, managing contracts, providing community outreach and engagement, reporting, and planning and implementation assistance.

4 solicit proposals for and prioritize projects whose primary objective
5 is to assist libraries operated by governmental units, as defined in
6 RCW 27.12.010, in acquiring, constructing, repairing, or
7 rehabilitating facilities.

8 (3) The department must establish a committee to develop the
9 grant program criteria established under subsection (2) of this
10 section and review proposals. The committee must be composed of five
11 members as provided in this subsection. The committee must include:
12 (a) A representative from the department of commerce; (b) a
13 representative from the department of archaeology and historic
14 preservation; (c) the state librarian; (d) a representative from a
15 library district; and (e) a representative from a municipal library.

16 (4) The department must conduct a statewide solicitation of
17 project applications. The department must evaluate and rank
18 applications in consultation with the committee established in
19 subsection (3) of this section, using objective criteria. The ranking
20 of projects must prioritize library district facilities listed on a
21 local, state, or federal register of historic places and those
22 located in distressed or rural counties. The evaluation and ranking
23 process must also include an examination of existing assets that
24 applicants propose to apply to projects. Grant assistance under this
25 section may not exceed 50 percent of the total cost of the project.
26 The nonstate portion of the total project cost may include cash, the
27 value of real property when acquired solely for the purpose of the
28 project, and in-kind contributions.

29 (5) The department must submit a prioritized list of recommended
30 projects to the governor and the legislature by October 1, 2026, for
31 inclusion in the department of commerce's 2027-2029 biennial capital
32 budget request. The list must include a description of each project,
33 the amount of recommended state funding, and documentation of
34 nonstate funds to be used for the project. Individual grants may not
35 exceed \$2,000,000. The total amount of recommended state funding for
36 the projects on a biennial project list may not exceed \$10,000,000.

37 (6) In contracts for grants authorized under this section, the
38 department must include provisions that require that capital
39 improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time
40 appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used

for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee must repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of Washington general obligation bonds issued on the date most close in time to the date of authorization of the grant.

(7) The department must assist grant recipients under this section to apply for applicable competitive federal grant funding and, upon receipt of any such funding, an equal amount of the state building construction account—state appropriation must be placed in unallotted status.

(1)(a) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for the department to administer noncompetitive grants to nonprofit organizations, local governments, federally recognized tribal governments and tribal entities, state agencies, housing authorities, ports, transit agencies, research organizations, and eligible third-party administrators for planning, design, and implementation of capital projects and clean energy technologies that reduce greenhouse gas emissions in vulnerable, overburdened, and tribal communities identified by the department. The department must prioritize grants providing meaningful benefits to vulnerable populations in overburdened communities, as defined in RCW 70A.02.010.

(b) Eligible uses of grant funds include, but are not limited to, planning for sustainable communities and predesign work, energy efficiency improvements, renewable energy generation, increasing the supply of affordable, energy efficient housing, developing resilient and sustainable infrastructure systems, zero-emission, active mobility, and micromobility transportation infrastructure, education and engagement, and workforce development.

(2) Up to three percent of the appropriation in this section is for the department to administer the grant program. Administration includes, but is not limited to, identifying eligible communities and eligible third-party administrators, providing technical assistance, managing contracts, reporting, and providing planning and implementation assistance.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "eligible third-party administrators" means entities that have sufficient expertise and relationships within the identified community to help plan for, design, or implement capital projects that reduce greenhouse gases or develop clean energy resources for the community.

(4)(a) Appropriations under this section not awarded and under contract by June 30, 2029, shall lapse. The department shall provide a report of lapsed appropriations to the legislative fiscal committees by January 15, 2030.

2025-27 High Efficiency Electric Appliance Rebates (HEAR) Program
(40000666)

The appropriation in this section is subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1)(a) \$25,000,000 of the climate commitment account—state appropriation is provided solely for the department to administer grants to eligible third-party administrators for heat pump and other high-efficiency electric equipment rebates, with a focus on low/moderate income households and small businesses. State incentives and rebates for installation of high-efficiency electric equipment, including electrical panel upgrades, provide a benefit to the public consistent with the state's energy strategy and climate mandates by reducing greenhouse gas emissions from the built environment.

(b) \$5,000,000 of the climate commitment account—state appropriation is provided solely for the department to administer grants to eligible third-party administrators for heat pumps for adult family homes.

(2) The department shall implement a statewide high-efficiency electric equipment program consistent with the following:

(a) Aid the transition of residential and commercial buildings away from fossil fuels by providing education and outreach resources for the installation of high-efficiency electric heat pumps and other high-efficiency electric equipment;

(b) Provide grants, coordination, and technical assistance to eligible third-party administrators to promote the adoption of high-

efficiency electric heat pump equipment for space and water heating;
and

(c) Develop strategies to ensure that the program serves low-income households, vulnerable populations, and overburdened communities, including dedicating a portion of the program funding for this purpose. For the purposes of this subsection (2)(c), "overburdened communities" has the same meaning in RCW 70A.65.010.

(3) For the purposes of this section, "eligible third-party administrators" include, but are not limited to, nonprofits, utilities, housing providers, community action agencies, and community-based organizations.

The appropriation in this section is subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for the department to issue grants to community hospitals or other community providers to expand and establish new and preserve existing capacity for behavioral health services in communities. The department must consult an advisory group consisting of representatives from the department of social and health services, the health care authority, one representative from a managed care organization, one representative from an accountable care organization, and one representative from the association of county human services. The amounts provided in this section may be used for construction and equipment costs associated with establishment or preservation of the facilities. The department may approve funding for the acquisition of a facility if the project will result in increased behavioral health capacity. Amounts provided in this section may not be used for operating costs associated with the treatment of patients using these services.

(2) The department must establish criteria for the issuance of the grants, which must include:

1 (a) Evidence that the application was developed in collaboration
2 with one or more regional behavioral health entities that administer
3 the purchasing of services;

4 (b) Evidence that the applicant has assessed and would meet gaps
5 in the geographical availability and service needs of behavioral
6 health services in their region;

7 (c) Evidence that the applicant is able to meet applicable
8 licensing and certification requirements in the facility that will be
9 used to provide services;

10 (d) A commitment by applicants to serve persons who are publicly
11 funded and persons detained for involuntary commitment under chapter
12 71.05 RCW;

13 (e) A commitment by the applicant to maintain and operate the
14 beds or facility for a time period commensurate to the state
15 investment, but for at least a 10-year period;

16 (f) The date upon which structural modifications or construction
17 would begin and the anticipated date of completion of the project;

(f) Facilities that provide substance use disorder intervention, assessment, and treatment services with secure withdrawal management and stabilization treatment beds that are not subject to federal funding restrictions that apply to institutions of mental diseases; and

(g) Facilities where behavioral health supportive services, such as harm reduction and physical health services, are offered within the same facility as behavioral health services and that are not subject to federal funding restrictions that apply to institutions of mental diseases.

(7) The amounts provided in this subsection are subject to the criteria in subsection (1) of this section. \$15,000,000 of the state building construction account—state appropriation in this section is provided solely for grants to community providers to prevent the closure of existing behavioral health facilities. For purposes of this subsection (7), the department must implement necessary procedures to enable rapid commitment of funds on a first-come, first-served basis to qualifying project proposals that satisfy the goal of long-term preservation of behavioral health facilities.

(16) During the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium, where the department has awarded a grant pursuant to an appropriation in the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium for the operation of a crisis diversion or stabilization facility located in Pierce county, the department may amend the contract associated with the grant in order to authorize the facility to be used for any community development block grant (CDBG) national objective.

(b) \$1,500,000 is provided solely for the Alpine Ridge Utility Upgrades project.

(1) \$7,350,000 of the Ruth Lecocq Kagi early learning facilities development account—state appropriation in this section is provided solely for minor renovation grants.

(2) (~~(\$46,550,000)~~) \$39,830,000 of the Ruth Lecocq Kagi early learning facilities development account—state and \$6,720,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities revolving account—state appropriations in this section (~~(is)~~) are provided solely for the early learning facility grant and loan program, subject to the provisions of RCW 43.31.573 through 43.31.583 and 43.84.092, to provide state assistance for designing, constructing, purchasing, expanding, or modernizing public or private early learning education facilities for eligible organizations. Up to four percent of the funding in this subsection may be used by the department of children, youth, and families to provide technical assistance to early learning providers interested in applying for the early learning facility grant or loan program.

FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

2024 Local and Community Projects (40000301)

The appropriations in this section are subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1) The department shall not expend the appropriation in this section unless and until the nonstate share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed, or both, in an amount sufficient to complete the project or a distinct phase of the project that is useable to the public for the purpose intended by the legislature. This requirement does not apply to projects where a share of the appropriation is for design costs only.

(2) Prior to receiving funds, project recipients must demonstrate that the project site is under control for a minimum of 10 years, either through ownership or a long-term lease. This requirement does not apply to appropriations for preconstruction activities or appropriations in which the sole purpose is to purchase real property that does not include a construction or renovation component.

(3) Projects funded in this section may be required to comply with Washington's high performance building standards under chapter 39.35D RCW.

(4) Project funds are available on a reimbursement basis only and may not be advanced under any circumstances.

(5) In contracts for grants authorized under this section, the department shall include provisions that require that capital improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee shall repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of Washington general obligation bonds issued most closely to the date of authorization of the grant.

(6) Projects funded in this section, including those that are owned and operated by nonprofit organizations, are generally required to pay state prevailing wages.

(7) The department must comply with the requirements set forth in executive order 21-02 and must consult with the department of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes on the potential effects of these projects on cultural resources and historic properties. Consultation with the department of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be initiated before project funds are made available.

2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure
4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond
5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the
6 appropriations contained in this act are \$76,597,763 for the
7 2025-2027 biennium, \$428,753,156 for the 2027-2029 biennium, and
8 \$659,947,312 for the 2029-2031 biennium.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND
10 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies
11 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency,
12 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in
13 not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing
14 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When
15 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most
16 economical financial contract option available, including long-term
17 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to
18 purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of

19 purposes of this section, "total anticipated cost" means the sum of
20 the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction
21 phases of the project.

22 (2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
23 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
24 the agency's predesign.

25 (3) The predesign must explore at least three project
26 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different
27 and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen
28 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective
29 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to,
30 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle
31 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign
32 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

33 (4) For projects exceeding the \$10,000,000 predesign threshold
34 established in this section, the office of financial management may
35 make an exception to some or all of the predesign requirements in
36 this section. The office of financial management shall report any
37 exception to the fiscal committees of the legislature:

38 (a) A description of the major capital project for which the
39 predesign waiver is made;

(b) An explanation of the reason for the waiver; and
(c) A rough order of magnitude cost estimate for the project's design and construction.

(5) In deliberations related to submitting an exception under this section, the office of financial management shall consider the following factors:

(a) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding the site of the project;

(b) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding whether the project will involve renovation, new construction, or both;

(c) Whether, within six years of submitting the request for funding, the agency has completed, or initiated the construction of, a substantially similar project;

(d) Whether there is any anticipated change to the project's program or the services to be delivered at the facility;

(e) Whether the requesting agency indicates that the project may not require some or all of the predesign requirements in this section due to a lack of complexity; and

(f) Whether any other factors related to project complexity or risk, as determined by the office of financial management, could reduce the need for, or scope of, a predesign.

(6) If under this section, some or all predesign requirements are waived, the office of financial management may instead propose a professional project cost estimate instead of a request for predesign funding.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8004.** (1) The legislature finds that use of life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects, engineers, and contractors in making design and construction decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

1 (2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives
2 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be
3 both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being
4 addressed. Agencies must choose the most reasonable and cost-
5 effective solution, as supported by the life-cycle cost analysis. A
6 brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen
7 must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the
8 predesign.

9 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available
10 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation
11 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in
12 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost

14 rates, and energy rates.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8007.** (1) The office of financial management may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the completion of such project to another capital project for which the appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or institution of higher education and only between capital projects that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur between projects to local government agencies except where the grants are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes that govern the grants.

(2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can be completed within the biennium for less than the amount appropriated in this act.

(3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a project in a different way.

(4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed with the fiscal committees of the legislature by the office of financial management at least 30 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers within 30 days from the date of transfer.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8008.** Any building project that receives over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to

sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be integrated into the building project:

(1) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative, integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water, materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

(2) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the size and complexity of the building and its system components in order to verify performance of building components and systems and help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan, verification of the installation and performance of systems to be commissioned, and a commissioning report.

(3) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building performance target that takes into account the intended use, occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by 50 percent below preretrofit baseline.

(4) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost effective.

(5) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

(6) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major construction and renovation projects to track and continuously optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate,

1 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
2 occupants on energy use.

3 (7) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
4 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
5 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
6 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8009.** State agencies, including institutions
8 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
9 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
10 for operating expenditures.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8010.** Executive Order No. 21-02,
12 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective April 7,
13 2021. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in this
14 executive order and must consult with the department of archaeology
15 and historic preservation and affected tribes on the potential
16 effects of projects on cultural resources and historic properties
17 proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition projects,
18 including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in
19 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department
20 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be
21 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to

24 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this

26 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

27 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
28 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work

31 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act

11 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
12 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
13 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
14 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
15 prior approval of the director of financial management in
16 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
17 of representatives capital budget committee.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8014.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
19 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
20 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
21 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
22 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
23 the intended state share of total project costs.

29 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8015.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
30 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
31 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
32 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
33 construction account as deemed necessary by the state treasurer, on
34 behalf of the state finance committee, to comply with the federal
35 internal revenue service rules and regulations pertaining to the use
36 of nontaxable bond proceeds. Portions of the general obligation bond

proceeds authorized by chapter . . ., Laws of 2025 ((Z-0218/25) state general obligation bonds and related accounts) for deposit into the state taxable building construction account that are in excess of amounts required to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules and regulations shall be deposited into the state building construction account. The state treasurer shall submit written notification to the director of financial management and the legislative evaluation and accountability program committee if it is determined that a shift of appropriation authority between the state building construction account, or any other account receiving bond proceeds, and the state taxable building construction account is necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state taxable building construction account, or any other account receiving taxable bond proceeds, to the state building construction account may be made.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8016.** (1) For the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium, unless otherwise specified for a single purpose, agencies are appropriated one lump sum for minor works projects. It is the intent of the legislature that appropriated funds be spent in the biennium for which they are appropriated.

(2) Minor works projects may not exceed \$4,000,000 for institutions of higher education and \$2,000,000 for all other agencies. Administrative fees may not exceed four percent for each project.

(3) Except as provided by the legislature, agencies are encouraged to prioritize minor works projects based on:

- (a) Health and safety of employees or clients served;
- (b) The amount of use of a given facility or system;
- (c) The avoidance of future increased costs of repair or maintenance; and
- (d) The avoidance of increased operating costs.

(4) Minor works appropriations may not be used for:

(a) Projects that are a phase of a larger project, and that if combined over a continuous period of time, would exceed the amounts provided in subsection (2) of this section;

(b) Studies, planning, or design, except for technical or engineering reviews or designs that lead directly to and support a minor works project;

(c) Movable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment not in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office of financial management, including rolling stock and computers;

(d) Software not dedicated to control of a specialized system;

(e) Moving expenses;

(f) Land or facility acquisition; or

(g) Funding for projects with funding shortfalls unless expressly authorized by the office of financial management for exigent circumstances with notice to the legislative fiscal committees.

(5) If a minor works appropriation does not specify it is to be used for preservation or program improvements, up to 25 percent of the appropriation may be used for program improvements. Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the Americans with disabilities act qualify as preservation improvements.

(6) Agencies must use reappropriations before newly appropriated amounts without regard to lists or projects that were submitted at the time the funds were appropriated.

(7) No later than December 15th of each even numbered year, agencies must submit to the governor, house capital budget committee, and senate ways and means committee, a list of minor works projects completed or in progress for the current biennium including: Project status, project cost, amount expended, and amount encumbered for projects not yet complete.

(8) Requests for minor works appropriations for the next biennium must take into account minor works amounts to be reappropriated and the amount of minor works projects that can reasonably be completed in the next biennium.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8017.** To the extent that any appropriation authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building construction account, or from any other capital project account in the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8018. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

(1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer to the water pollution control revolving account—state, up to \$20,500,000 for fiscal year 2026 and up to \$20,500,000 for fiscal year 2027. \$41,000,000

(2) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer to the drinking water assistance account—state, up to \$12,500,000 for fiscal year 2026 and up to \$12,500,000 for fiscal year 2027. \$25,000,000

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8019.** The department of natural resources must coordinate with the department of social and health services on any long-term, revenue-generating opportunities it pursues on the Fircrest campus to ensure that the clients served by the residential habilitation center and its daily operations will not be negatively impacted.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8020.** In order to accelerate the reduction of embodied carbon and improve the environmental performance of construction materials, agencies shall, whenever possible, review and consider embodied carbon reported in environmental product declarations when evaluating proposed structural materials for construction projects.
